In continuing this tradition of service, we are offering scholarships in the amount of up to \$1,500.00. By offering this award we hope to encourage and reward academic achievement by providing financial assistance to students pursuing higher education at a Historically Black College or University.

Applicants must meet the following requirements:

Eligibility: An applicant must be 1.) currently enrolled at an accredited Historically Black College or University (HBCU) in the fall of 2019, 2.) be from Southern California, and 3.) have a minimum grade point average of 2.5.

Application: An applicant must submit a **typewritten** application accompanied by **an official transcript as well as an essay**. Your essay must be a maximum of three (3) double-spaced, typewritten pages stating educational goals, career aspirations and any information expressing financial need. Additionally 1-2 letters of recommendation is recommended but not required.

Deadline: Applicant must return all material no later than **June 14, 2019**. Applications postmarked after June 14, 2019 will not be considered.

Selection Procedure: The Education/Scholarship Committee will review each application and a winner will be notified by the July 21, 2019.

Awards: Each recipient will be required to submit proof of full time enrollment for the fall of 2019 semester/quarter at the Historically Black College or University. Proof of enrollment qualifies as a letter or course print-out from the university's registrar office. Scholarship checks will not be issued until proof of enrollment is received.
